

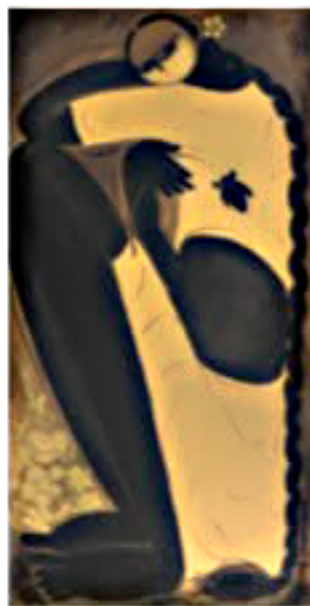
Where Art Finds a Home. And Life Finds Inspiration.

Affordable September 2026 returns for its 14th edition, bringing original Indian art within reach of both first-time and seasoned collectors.

This September, Aakriti Art Gallery returns with the 14th edition of Affordable September, its annual exhibition that has spent thirteen years reshaping the way Kolkata collects art. What began in 2013 with a simple proposition - making original Indian art accessible beyond established collectors - has grown into a fixture of the city's cultural calendar.

Established in 2005, Aakriti Art Gallery has sustained Affordable September through changing markets and even the pandemic, when the exhibition moved online as well as continuing on the floor.

Over the years, it has brought together celebrated names from modern Indian art, including Jogen Chowdhury, K.G. Subramanyan, M.F.



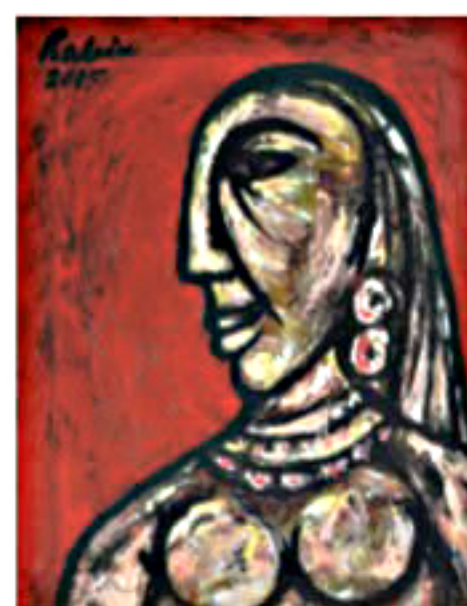

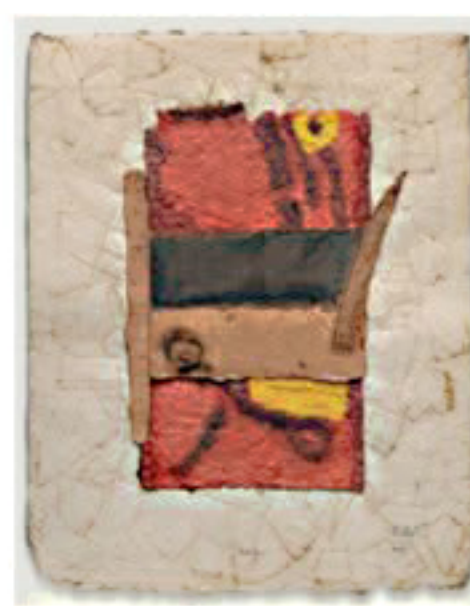

mixed media. Prices range from ₹3,000 to ₹3,00,000, creating possibilities for both first-time buyers and experienced collectors.

The exhibition also arrives during Aakriti's 20th anniversary year, marking two decades of exhibitions, publications, artist support and collecting. Affordable September continues that journey by inviting visitors not merely to look at art, but to take a work home and make it part of everyday life.
